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A PRAYER OF SALVATION

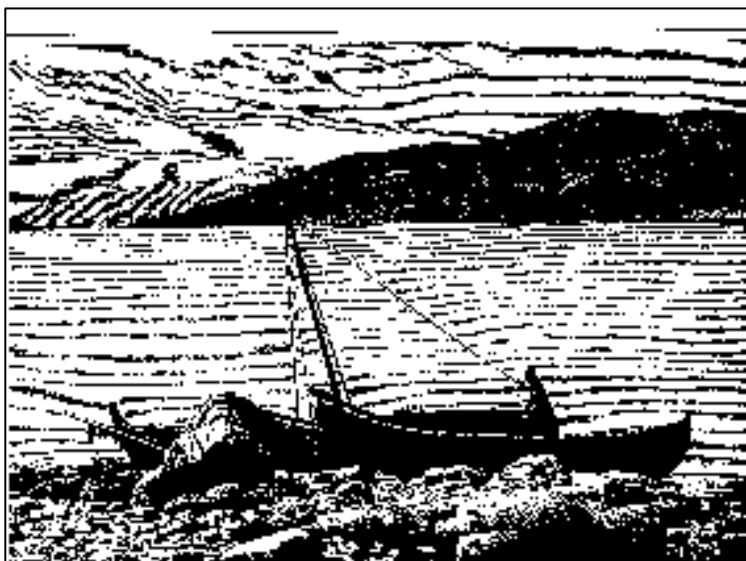
I surrender myself, my life, to You. I ask You to forgive my sin and to give me the Holy Spirit.

A PRAYER OF DELIVERANCE

DEAR LORD JESUS,

I look to You as refuge, fortress, and strength. I confess that I am guilty of sin, iniquity, and transgression. I submit to You, God. I draw near to You that You may draw near to me. I cleanse my hands and purify my heart. I am miserable and mourn and weep. My laughter is turned into mourning and my joy into gloom. I humble myself in the presence of the Lord that He may exalt me. I repent of my sins.....The word is near me, in my mouth and in my heart. I confess with my mouth that Jesus is Lord and believe in my heart that God raised Him from the dead. Forgive me now, and cleanse me with Your Blood.

I give myself to You, dear Jesus, my body, soul, and spirit. You are my Lord, my Savior, my Master, my Deliverer. Thank You, Jesus, for saving my soul.

Today I ask You to completely cleanse me, my body, mind, will, and emotions. Deliver me, Lord, from any stronghold Satan may have in my life, whether of my sins or those of my ancestors or of whatever cause. Deliver me from the tormentors, Lord, that afflict me, because I still need to forgive those who have hurt me.

I lay down all resentment, bitterness, and malice, and I forgive (During this time allow and ask the Holy Spirit to bring names and situations to your mind.). I release them from my judgment. I release You, God, from my judgment. I accept and receive forgiveness. I lay down any pride and self-hatred, and accept Your acceptance of me in Christ.

Dear Jesus, I want to be sure that satan's power over me and my family line is completely destroyed. I now renounce for myself and for my ancestors all dealings with occult powers, in any form, and I break all cords of the past, back 12 generations and "to the garden." I renounce all satanic involvement, including but not limited to: witchcraft, sorcery, astrology, horoscopes, ouija boards, fortune telling, palm reading, seances, necromancy, ESP, levitation, transcendental meditation, hypnosis, soul travel, tea leaf reading, automatic handwriting, martial arts, numerology, the pendulum, water-witching, spirit guides, tarot cards, curses, charms, fetishes, psychic powers, and all psychic healing.

I renounce every cult or religion that denies the Blood of Christ, or the divinity of Christ, or the humanity of Christ. I renounce all satanic involvement, including but not limited to: books, television shows, movies, music, magazines, internet activities, and games that glorify occult practices or experiences or that are perversions of the truth (including sexual sins and

practices). I renounce free masonry and brotherhood or sisterhood organizations that are perversions of the truth.

Through the Blood of Jesus, I break all ungodly soul ties and bondages. I renounce satan and all his works. I declare that satan has no place in me, and no power/authority over me. Through the Blood of Jesus I loose myself from satan and his dominion in the Name of Jesus. I command every evil spirit to leave me, right now, in Jesus' Name. I command you to leave without doing harm and to go where Jesus Christ tells you to go.

As my Deliverer, Lord, You know all my problems, all the things that bind, torment, defile, harass, and oppress me. Any thing and every thing not the Holy Spirit of God, leave me now. GO...where Jesus tells you to go.

I confess that my body is a temple for the Holy Spirit, redeemed, cleansed, justified, sanctified, by the Blood of Jesus.

I renounce, break, and loose myself and my family line from all psychic heredity, psychic powers, bonds of physical or mental illness, or curses, upon me or my family line, as the result of sin, transgressions, iniquities, occult, or psychic involvement of myself, my parents, my ancestors. I break and cancel all evil curses, charms, vexes, hexes, spells, jinxes, bewitchments, witchcraft, guilt, intimidation, domination, or sorcery put upon me from any person or persons or from any occult source. I refuse to be under the control or influence of anything or anyone other than to be led by the Holy Spirit of God and to walk in the Spirit.

Thank You, Jesus, for setting me free.

Holy Father in Heaven, in the Name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, the Incarnate Word, I ask that You fill every vacant place with the promised Holy Spirit, with Your Word, Your redemption, Your peace, Your presence. I ask that You bring healing and restoration to my body and to my soul, clearing out any debris and cleaning up any remaining damage. Father, give me the promised Holy Spirit. May Your Holy Spirit be poured out upon me with power. May You clothe me with power from on high. May I grow in grace. May the grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, the love of You, Father, and the fellowship/communion of the Holy Spirit be with me, as You have promised to never leave me or forsake me.

I give You praise for who You are. You are Light and Love and Life and are with me. You are my righteousness, the only Righteous One, my peace, my sanctifier, my healer, my provider, my banner of victory, my shepherd, my shield, my strength, my guide, the One who gives me life.

A PRAYER FOR THE HEART

Holy Father, I thank You for Your presence in my life. May the words of my mouth and the meditations of my heart be acceptable to You. If I regard wickedness in my heart, the Lord will not hear; but certainly God has heard; You have given heed to the voice of my prayer (Psalm 66.18, 19). My heart shall live forever (Psalm 22.26). I keep my heart with all diligence; for out of it are the issues of life (Proverbs 4.23). My heart is fixed: I will sing and give praise (Psalm 57.7).

You, Lord, search the heart, try the reins, even to give every person according to his ways, and according to the fruit of his doings (Jeremiah 17.10). For out of the heart proceed evil thoughts and such as defiles the person (Matthew 15.19). Therefore, I pray, God, that the thought of my heart may be forgiven me (Acts 8.22).

I prepare my heart to seek the Lord, and I shall love the Lord my God with all my heart, and with all my soul, and with all my might. And the words which God has commanded me shall be in my heart (Deuteronomy 6.5, 6). O that there were such a heart in me that I would fear You, and keep all Your commandments always, that it might be well with me (Deuteronomy 5.29).

My merry heart makes a cheerful countenance. My heart has understanding and seeks knowledge. I have a continual feast (Proverbs 15.13-15). Give me a heart of flesh that I may walk in Your statutes, and keep Your ordinances, and do them (Ezekiel 11.19, 20).

Your Word is quick and powerful, and sharper than any two-edged sword, piercing even to the dividing asunder of soul and spirit, and of the joints and marrow, and is a discerner of the thoughts and intents of my heart (Hebrews 4.12). Your Word have I hid in my heart that I might not sin against You (Psalm 119.11). I shall run the way of Your commandments, for You will enlarge my heart (Psalm 119.33). Search me, O God, and know my heart. Try me and know my anxious thoughts, and see if there be any hurtful way in me, and lead me in the everlasting way (Psalm 139.23, 24). I want to love You, Lord.

A PRAYER FOR PEACE

My heavenly Father,

This is the day the Lord has made. I will rejoice and be glad in it (Psalm 118.24). I trust in You, delight myself in You, Lord, commit my way unto You this day, and rest in You, waiting patiently for You (Psalm 37.3-7). I am happy inasmuch as my God is the Lord (Psalm 144.15).

Thank You, Father, that You rejoice over me with joy (Zephaniah 3.17). You redeem my life from the pit, satisfy me with good things and execute righteousness and judgment for all that are oppressed (Psalm 103.4-6). You comfort the waste places and provide joy and gladness, thanksgiving and the voice of melody (Isaiah 51.3). The joy of the Lord is my strength (Nehemiah 8.10), and even today I count it all joy when I encounter tests or trials (James 1.2).

I have been delivered from the power of darkness and translated into the kingdom of Your dear Son (Colossians 1.13). The law of the Spirit of life in Christ Jesus has made me free from the law of sin and death (Romans 8.2). Therefore, I can know the peace of God which passes all understanding.

I keep my mind stayed on You (Isaiah 26.3). I humble myself under Your mighty hand that in due time You may exalt me, and I cast my care upon You as You command (1 Peter 5.6, 7). Here are my concerns today:

TOWARD INNER HEALING

The prayer of faith regarding the healing of the inner person allows Jesus, the healer, to touch the mind, the emotions, painful memories, dreams, etc. In the process the person is set free from rejection, resentment, anger, self-pity, guilt, shame, depression, fear, sorrow, hatred, condemnation, and worthlessness. Jesus can open prison doors and release the wounded and imprisoned. Crippling pain can disappear. Barriers to wholeness can be removed.

As you allow the Holy Spirit perfect liberty and freedom of movement, giving Him access to your mind, soul, spirit, and life, and as you ask Him to help you pray, He will guide you into forgiveness. You might pray something like this:

LORD JESUS CHRIST, it is my desire to forgive everyone in my life. You love me, and the Father loves me even as He loves You (John 17). I want to be made whole, and I thank You that You are my healer. I ask, by the power of the Holy Spirit and on the merits of Your Blood shed for me, to be taken back even to conception, and to forgive:

YOU, FATHER GOD, and ask You to forgive me for false ideas about You, and as regards these situations and circumstances

I ask forgiveness for not receiving Your forgiveness and for not acting as forgiven regarding my sins, faults, iniquities, failings, and transgressions, particularly as concerns I ask forgiveness for self-hatred and for not accepting who I am in Jesus Christ as Your Word proclaims.

Thank You for Your grace. You are the God of all grace, my Lord and Savior. I choose to serve You and reject and renounce serving satan and sin.

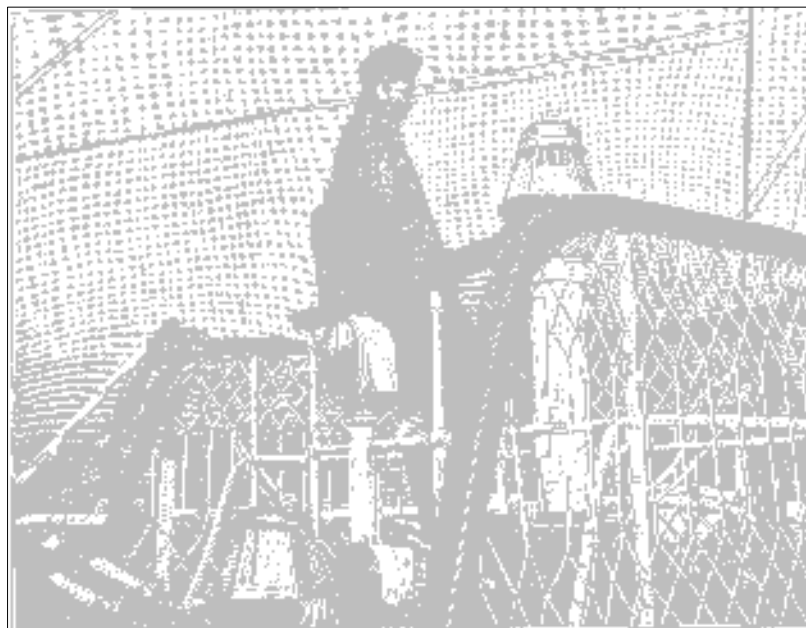
I FORGIVE my mother, my father, sisters, brothers, relatives, spouse(s), children, in-laws, co-workers, neighbors, fellow students, classmates, clergy, congregations, churches, social and civic affiliations, those of differing persuasions and beliefs (e.g., cultures, races, religions, politics, academics), professional people, service and repair people, employers, employees, teachers, instructors, friends, lenders, borrowers, law enforcement agencies, government officials and agents, those in authority over me, persons with whom I have had money dealings.....concerning.....

I ASK FOR GRACE to forgive that one or ones who have offended, hurt, and wronged me the most, my greatest enemy, the one I said I would or could never forgive. I forgive _____ and release _____ from my judgment.

LORD JESUS, I ask forgiveness for my own offenses, wounds, hurts, and wrongs committed against others. Forgive me for omissions as well. Free me from unforgiveness wherever You find it in me. Grant me faith, repentance, humility, reconciliation. Let Your Holy Spirit fill me with Your light, peace, renewal

LORD JESUS, walk me back through my life. Heal me, my memories, and make me whole. Release me from any prison and set me free. Set me free from any fears, rejection, lack of love, voids, hurts, empty places, loneliness, broken places, failures, jealousies, disappointments, and _____. Let Your light dispel darkness in the recesses of my mind. Help me to love as You love. Fill me with Yourself.

And now, to You, Lord Jesus, who love me and have loosed me from my sins in Your own precious Blood, loose me also from the effects of the sins of others. To You be glory and power, dominion and praise, for ever and ever (Revelation 1.5, 6). Amen.



PRAYER FOR RENEWING THE MIND

Holy Father, I thank You that I shall prosper and be in health, even as my soul prospers (3 John 2). I have the mind of Christ, the Messiah, and do hold the thoughts, feelings, and purposes of His heart (1 Corinthians 2.16). I trust in You, Lord, with all my heart. I lean not unto my own understanding, but in all my ways, I acknowledge You, and You shall direct my paths (Proverbs 3.5, 6).

Today I submit myself to Your Word which is able to expose and discern the very thoughts and purposes of my heart (Hebrews 4.12). The weapons of my warfare are not carnal, but mighty through You to the pulling down of strongholds, casting down vain imaginations. I refute arguments and every proud and lofty thing that exalts itself against the true knowledge of God; and I lead every thought captive to the obedience of Christ (2 Corinthians 10.4, 5).

Today I shall be transformed by the renewing of my mind, that I may prove what is that good, and acceptable, and perfect, will of God (Romans 12.2). Your Word, Lord, shall not depart out of my mouth; but I shall meditate on it day and night, that I may observe to do according to all that is written therein; for then I shall make my way prosperous; then I shall have good success (Joshua 1.8).

My thoughts are the thoughts of the diligent which tend only to plenteousness (Proverbs 21.5). Therefore, I will not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication, with thanksgiving, I will make my requests known. Your peace which transcends all understanding shall guard my heart and mind in Christ Jesus. Today I fix my mind on whatever is true, whatever is worthy of reverence and is honorable and seemly, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is kind. If there is any virtue and excellence, if there is anything worthy of praise, I will think on these things (Philippians 4.6-8).

Today I commit to You, Lord, whatever I do, trusting that my plans will succeed (Proverbs 16.3).

With my soul, I bless You, Lord (Psalm 103.1). Grant me grace to keep my mind stayed upon You (Isaiah 26.3) and grace that I might remain in Your presence. Help me to walk in love and not keep records of wrongs (1 Corinthians 13). Help me to set my mind on things above and not on earthly things (Colossians 3.2).

In Jesus' Name, I will practice what I have learned and received and heard and seen in Christ and model my way of living on it, and the God of peace will be with me (Philippians 4.9).

Thank You, Father, that my life is hid with Christ in God and that I have redemption and renewal in Jesus (Colossians 3).

TO RELEASE THE POWER OF THE BLOOD

Holy Father,

Your Word says, "If we say we have no sin, we are deceiving ourselves, and the truth is not in us. If we confess our sins, You are faithful and righteous to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness. If we say that we have not sinned, we make You a liar, and Your word is not in us (1 John 1.8-10)." You also say that all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God. Through faith in Jesus Christ for all those who believe we are being justified as a gift by Your grace through the redemption which is in Christ Jesus; whom You, God, displayed publicly as a propitiation (substitute) in Jesus' Blood through faith to declare and demonstrate His righteousness, because in Your forbearance, God, You passed over the sins previously committed. You are the justifier of the one who has faith in Jesus (Romans 3.22-26). I know that God is light, and in Him there is no darkness at all. If we say that we have fellowship with You and yet walk in the darkness, we lie and do not practice the truth; but if we walk in the light as You Yourself are in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the Blood of Jesus Your Son cleanses us from all sin (1 John 1.5-7).

I apply the Blood of Jesus, the Blood of the Lamb, to me, my home, my possessions and assets everywhere, to my whole past and present and future and to _____, declaring that You demonstrated Your own love toward me in that while I was yet a sinner, Christ died for me. Much more then, having now been justified by His Blood, I shall be saved from the wrath of God through Him, and I am saved by His life and receive the reconciliation (Romans 5.8-11). I confess my sins, and ask You to search me now

You purchased me with Your own Blood. Jesus, You obtained for me eternal redemption and so how much more will the Blood of Christ, who through the eternal Spirit offered Himself without blemish to God, cleanse my conscience from dead works to serve You, the Living God? All things are cleansed with blood, and without the shedding of blood there is no forgiveness (Hebrews 9.14, 22). There is peace through the Blood His (Jesus) cross whether things on earth or things in heaven (Colossians 1.20). Jesus has rendered the devil powerless (Hebrews 2.14). No plague will befall me to destroy me, no destroyer will come in to my house to smite me (Exodus 12.13, 29.37). The Blood covers me as a tabernacle and vessel of ministry (Hebrews 9.21). Jesus loves me and released me from my sins by His Blood and He has made me to be a king (kingdom) and priest to His God and Father; to Him be the glory and dominion forever (Revelation 1.5, 6).

I wash my robes and am made white in the Blood of the Lamb (Revelation 7.14). I am redeemed (1 Peter 1.17-19). When the kindness of God my Savior and His love for mankind appeared, He saved me, not on the basis of deeds which I have done in righteousness, but according to His mercy, by the

washing of regeneration and renewing by the Holy Spirit, whom He poured out upon me richly through Jesus Christ, my Savior, that being justified by His grace I might be made an heir according to the hope of eternal life (Titus 3.4-8).

I overcome satan by the Blood of the Lamb and by the word of the testimony, and I love not my life even unto the end. The accuser is cast down (Revelation 12.10, 11). I am loosed from my sins and from the effects of the sins of others by the Blood of Jesus as I am forgiven and forgive others, releasing them and my circumstance to God. I am a child of the King of kings and Lord of lords. The Lord is the Spirit, where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is liberty (2 Corinthians 3.17). Jesus is the High Priest of this my confession of faith in His atoning and cleansing Blood. Therefore, I come boldly to the throne of GRACE to obtain mercy and to find grace and favor in time of need (Hebrews 4.16).

A PRAYER FOR HOPE

Hope in New Testament Greek is from the word “elpizo.” “Elpizo” is often translated as “trust” as well as “hope.”

Dear Heavenly Father,

I come to You declaring my trust in Jesus Christ alone for my salvation. I confess to You my sin and willingness to repent and believe the gospel. I do believe that Jesus Christ died for my sin and paid the penalty You require.

Lord Jesus, I receive You into my heart and acknowledge You as Lord and Master over my life.

I welcome You, Holy Spirit of God, and ask You to come and fill me this day.

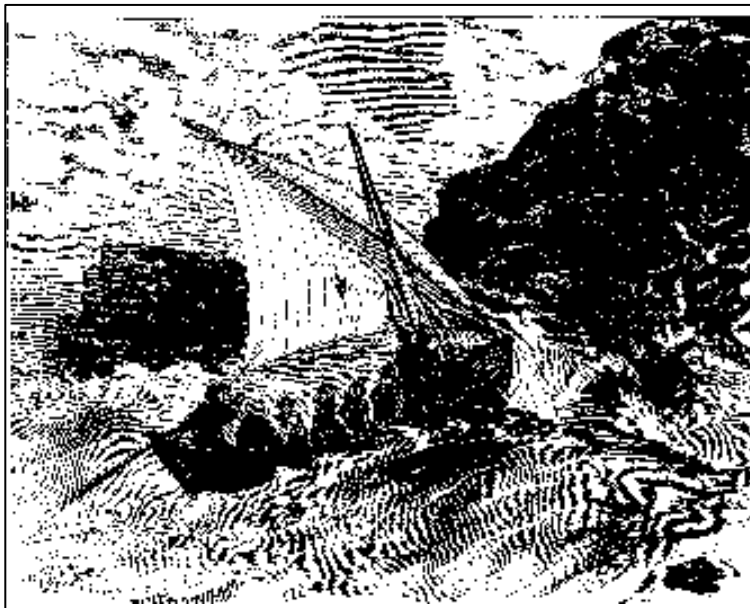
Today, I especially ask for hope, to be able to trust You in regards to all aspects of myself. “For we are saved by hope: but hope that is seen is not hope: for what a man sees, why does he yet hope? But if we hope for that we see not, then do we with patience wait for it (Romans 8.24, 25).” Come, Holy Spirit, and help me in my infirmity, for I know not for what I should pray as I ought. Please help my intercession according to the promise of Your Word (Romans 8.26).

I know that “faith is the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen (Hebrews 11.1).” I trust in the living God. “For the needy shall not always be forgotten: the expectation of the poor shall not perish forever (Psalm 9.18).” I shall be of good courage and God shall strengthen my heart as I hope in the Lord (Psalm 31.24). Let Your mercy, O Lord, be upon me, according as I hope in You (Psalm 33.18). “Why art thou cast down, O my soul? And why art thou disquieted within me? Hope in God: for I shall yet praise Him who is the health of my countenance, and my God (Psalm 43.5).” “I will hope continually, and will yet praise You more and more (Psalm 71.14).” I will set my hope in God, and not forget Your works, but keep Your commandments (Psalm 78.7).

My soul faints for Your salvation, but I hope in Your Word. Let me not be ashamed of my hope (Psalm 119.81, 116). Your Word says that the hope of the righteous shall be gladness (Proverbs 10.28), and though hope deferred makes the heart sick, when the desire comes, it is a tree of life (Proverbs 13.12). By Jesus Christ, I have access by faith into this grace wherein I stand, and I rejoice in hope of the glory of God. I also glory in tribulation because tribulation works patience, and patience, experience; and experience, hope. And hope makes not ashamed; because the love of God is shed abroad in my heart by the Holy Ghost which is given unto me (Romans 5.2-5).

I through the Spirit wait for the hope of righteousness by faith (Galatians 5.5). There is a hope laid up for me in heaven, whereof I heard before in the word of the truth of the gospel. I continue in the faith grounded and settled, and I am not moved away from the hope of the gospel. I ask for, Father God, the revelation knowledge of what is the riches of the glory of the mystery, Christ in me, the hope of glory (Colossians 1.5, 23, 27). Father, You have loved me, and my hope is an anchor for my soul (Hebrews 6.19).

A PRAYER FOR GOD'S PRESENCE

Holy Father,

I thank You that I have received Jesus, and You have given me power to become the child of God, the spirit of adoption by which I may call You "Father" (John 1.12; Romans 8). I thank You for the Blood Covenant and that Jesus my Lord is surety of that covenant sealed by the Holy Spirit.

Father, I praise You that You are Jehovah Shammah, "Jehovah is there" (Ezekiel 48.35), that You desire my fellowship, that You are present and alive in me (John 15). I praise You that You never leave me or forsake me, that although I have at times abandoned You, You will never abandon me (Hebrews 13). I praise You, Jesus, that Your name is Immanuel, i.e., "God with us."

Thank You, Father. I know that I am the temple of God and that the Spirit of God dwells in me (1 Corinthians 3.16), that You will be/are my God, and I shall be/am Yours (2 Corinthians 6.16), Christ in me, the hope of glory (Colossians 1.27). I know that "glory" relates to "shekinah," which means to live in You. You live in me, walk with me, and are my God (2 Corinthians 6.16). My citizenship is in heaven. So I say, "Let Your kingdom come and Your will be done on earth as it is in Heaven" and I say, "Blessing and honor and glory and power be unto Jehovah who sits upon the throne and unto the Lamb forever and ever (Revelation 5.13)." I look forward to the glimpse of glory in Revelation 21. I say, "Let Your kingdom come. Let Your power come. Let Your glory come...in me."

Therefore my heart is glad, and my glory rejoices: my flesh also shall rest in hope. You will show me the path of life: in Your presence is fullness of joy; at Your right hand there are pleasures forevermore (Psalm 16.9, 11).

I do not fear, for You are with me. I do not anxiously look about me, for You are my God. You will strengthen me, surely You will help me, surely You will uphold me with Your righteous right hand. You are the LORD my God, who upholds my right hand, who says to me, "Do not fear. I will help you." So I will rejoice in the LORD. I will glory in the Holy One of Israel (Isaiah 41). In righteousness I will be established; I will be FAR from oppression, for I will not fear; and from terror, for it will not come near me. Behold they shall gather together, but not by You. Whosoever shall gather together against me shall fall for my sake. You, Yourself, have created the smith who blows the fire of coals, and brings out a weapon for its work; and You have created the destroyer to ruin. No weapon formed against me shall prosper; and every tongue that accuses me in judgment I will condemn. This is my heritage as a servant of the Lord, and my vindication is from You (Isaiah 54).

For the mountains may be removed and the hills may shake, but Your lovingkindness will not be removed from me, and Your covenant of peace will not be shaken. You have compassion on me (Isaiah 54). You have redeemed me and called me by name; I am Yours. When I pass through the waters, You will be with me; and through the rivers, they will not overflow me. When I walk through the fire, I will not be scorched, nor will the flame burn me. For You are the LORD my God, the Holy One of Israel, my Savior. Since I am precious in Your sight, since I am honored and You



love me, You will give other men in my place and other peoples in exchange for my life. You are with me. (Isaiah 43)

Where can I go from Your Spirit? Or where can I flee from Your presence? If I ascend to heaven, You are there; if I make my bed in Sheol, behold, You are there. If I take the wings of the dawn, if I dwell in the remotest part of the sea, even there Your hand will lead me, and Your right hand will lay hold of me. If I say, "Surely the darkness will overwhelm me, and the light around me will be night," even the darkness is not dark to You, and the night is as bright as the day. Darkness and light are alike to You. Wonderful are Your works, and my soul knows it very well. (Psalm 139)

I thank You, Father, that You have chosen me and not rejected me. You are a father to the fatherless in Your holy habitation and You make a home for the lonely (Psalm 68.5, 6).

I will hold fast the confession of my hope without wavering, for You who promised are faithful, and I will consider how to stimulate others to love and good deeds, not forsaking assembling together, as is the habit of some, but I will encourage others and all the more, as I see the day drawing near. (Hebrews 10.23, 24)

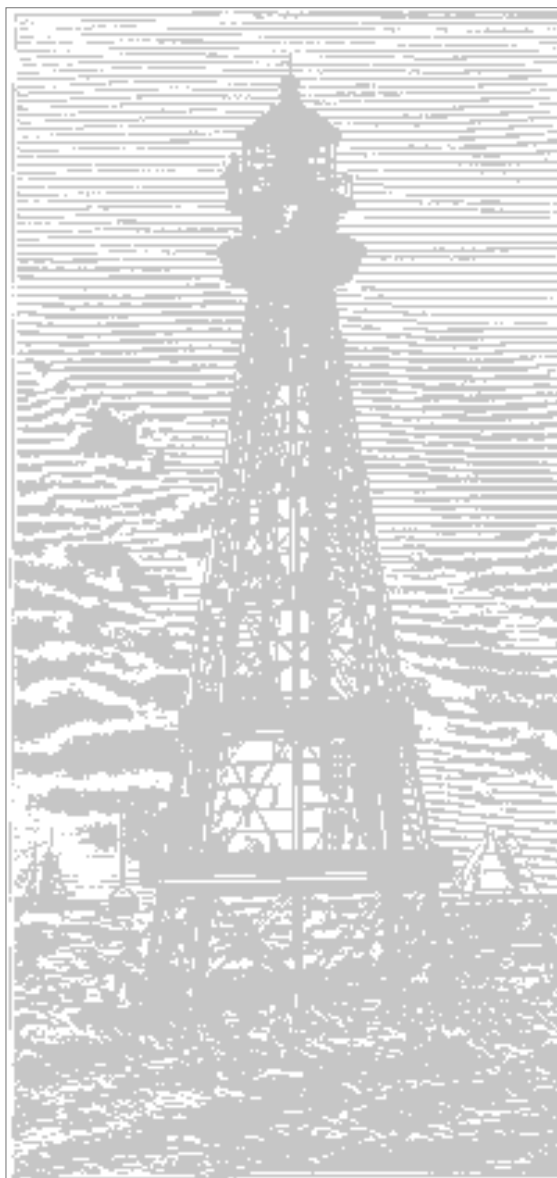

A PRAYER FOR HUMILITY

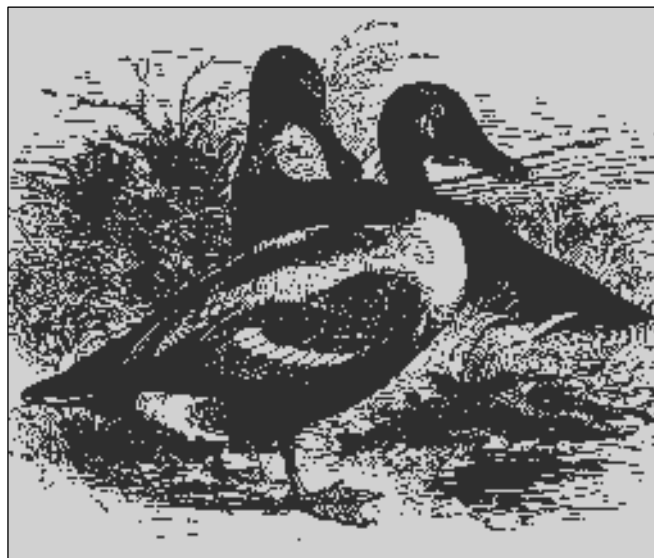

You will cleanse me from all my iniquity, whereby I have sinned against You. You will pardon me my transgressions. I praise You, for You are good and merciful. I bring You the sacrifice of praise (Jeremiah 33.8, 11). By mercy and truth iniquity is purged; and by the fear of the Lord, I depart from evil (Proverbs 6.16).

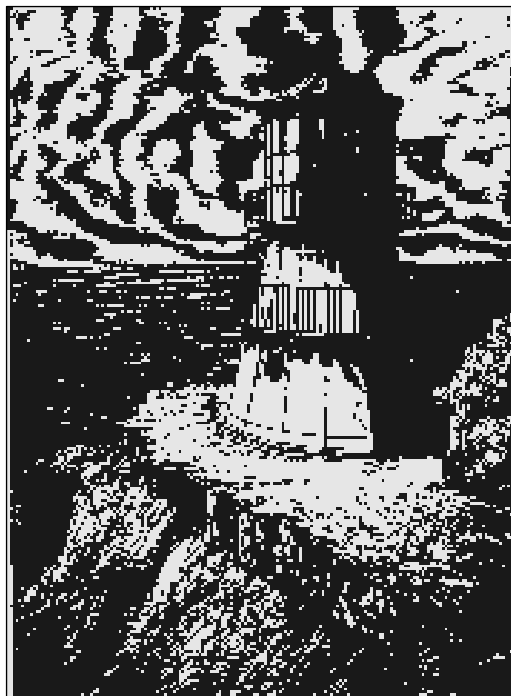

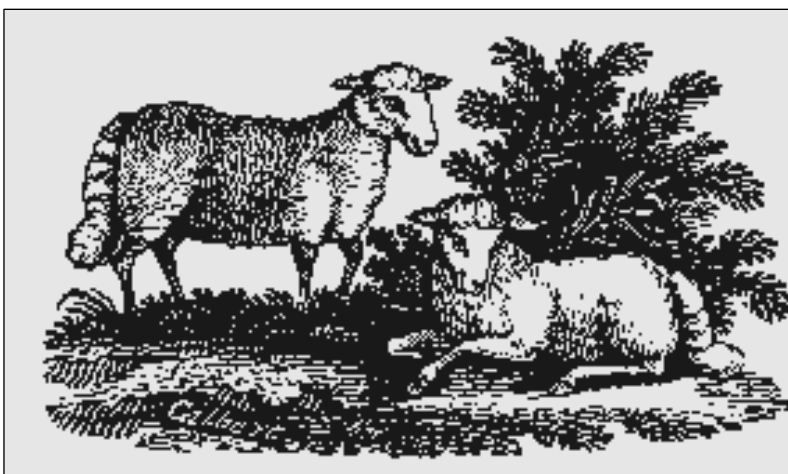
THE TWENTY-THIRD PSALM

ROMANS 8 FOR ME

I THANK YOU GOD:

There is therefore now no condemnation to me as I am in Christ Jesus. I walk not after the flesh, but after the Spirit. The law of the Spirit of life in Christ Jesus has made me free from the law of sin and death.

For what the law could not do, in that it was weak through the flesh, God sending His own Son in the likeness of sinful flesh, and for sin, condemned sin in the flesh: That the righteousness of the law might be fulfilled in me, who walk not after the flesh, but after the Spirit.

For if I am after the flesh I do mind the things of the flesh; but if I am after the Spirit, the things of the Spirit. For to be carnally minded is death; but to be spiritually minded is life and peace. Because the carnal mind is enmity against God: for it is not subject to the law of God, neither indeed can be. So then if I am in the flesh, I cannot please God.

But I am not in the flesh, but in the Spirit, if so be that the Spirit of God dwells in me. Now if any one has not the Spirit of Christ, that one is none of His. And if Christ be in me, the body is dead because of sin; but the Spirit is life because of righteousness.

But if the Spirit of Him that raised up Jesus from the dead dwells in me, He that raised up Christ from the dead shall also quicken my mortal body by His Spirit that dwells in me.

Therefore, I am debtor, not to the flesh, to live after the flesh. For if I live after the flesh, I shall die; but if I through the Spirit do mortify the deeds of the body, I shall live. For as many as are led by the Spirit of God, they are the children of God.

For I have not received the spirit of bondage again to fear; but I have received the Spirit of adoption, whereby I cry, Abba, Father. The Spirit itself bears witness with my spirit, that I am the child of God: and if a child, then an heir; an heir of God, and joint-heir with Christ; if so be that I suffer with Him, that I may be also glorified together.

For I reckon that the sufferings of this present time are not worthy to be compared with the glory which shall be revealed in me. For the earnest expectation of the creature waits for the manifestation of the children of God. For the creature was made subject to vanity, not willingly, but by reason of Him who has subjected the same in hope, because the creature itself also shall be delivered from the bondage of corruption into the glorious liberty of the children of God. For I know that the whole creation groans and travails in pain together until now.

And not only they, but I myself also, who has the firstfruits of the Spirit, even I myself groan within myself, waiting for the adoption, to wit, the redemption of my body.

For I am saved by hope: but hope that is seen is not hope: for what a person sees, why does that person yet hope for? But if I hope for that I see not, then do I with patience wait for it.

Likewise the Spirit also helps my infirmities: for I know not what I should pray for as I ought: but the Spirit itself makes intercession for me with groanings which cannot be uttered. And He that searches the hearts knows what is the mind of the Spirit, because He makes intercession for the saints according to the will of God.

And I know that all things work together for good to them that love God, to them who are the called according to His purpose. For whom He did foreknow, He also did predestinate to be conformed to the image of His Son, that He might be the firstborn among many brethren. Moreover whom He did predestinate, them He also called: and whom He called, them He also justified: and whom He justified, them He also glorified.

What shall I then say to these things? If God be for me, who can be against me? He that spared not His own Son, but delivered Him up for us all, how shall He not with Him also freely give me all things? Who shall lay anything to the charge of God's elect? It is God that justifies.

Who is he that condemns? It is Christ that died, yea rather, that is risen again, who is even at the right hand of God, who also makes intercession for me.

Who shall separate me from the love of Christ? Shall tribulation, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or peril, or sword? As it is written, For thy sake I am killed all the day long; I am accounted as sheep for the slaughter.

Nay, in all these things I am more than a conqueror through Him that loved me. For I am persuaded, that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor powers, nor things present, nor things to come, nor height, nor depth, nor any other creature, shall be able to separate me from the love of God, which is in Christ Jesus my Lord.

Hallelujah! Amen.



AGREEMENT WITH JESUS' PRAYER (JOHN 17)

Holy Father, these words spake Jesus, and He lifted up His eyes to heaven. I now come into agreement with this prayer and I, too, offer it up to You. Jesus said,

Father, the hour is come; glorify Thy Son, that Thy Son also may glorify Thee: As Thou hast given Him power over all flesh, that He should give eternal life to as many as Thou hast given Him. And this is life eternal, that they might know Thee the only true God, and Jesus Christ, whom Thou hast sent.

I have glorified Thee on the earth: I have finished the work which Thou gavest Me to do. And now, O Father, glorify Thou Me with Thine own self with the glory which I had with Thee before the world was. I have manifested Thy name unto the men which Thou gavest Me out of the world: Thine they were, and Thou gavest them Me; and they have kept Thy word. Now they have known that all things whatsoever Thou hast given Me are of Thee. For I have given unto them the words which Thou gavest Me; and they have received them, and have known surely that I came out from Thee, and they have believed that Thou didst send me.

I pray for them; I pray not for the world, but for them which Thou hast given Me; for they are Thine. And all Mine are Thine, and Thine are Mine; and I am glorified in them. And now I am no more in the world, but these are in the world, and I come to Thee.

Holy Father, keep through Thine own name those whom Thou hast given Me, that they may be one, as We are. While I was with them in the world, I kept them in Thy name: those that Thou gavest Me I have kept, and none of them is lost, but the son of perdition; that the scripture might be fulfilled.

And now come I to Thee; and these things I speak in the world, that they might have My joy fulfilled in themselves. I have given them Thy word; and the world hath hated them, because they are not of the world, even as I am not of the world.

I pray not that Thou shouldest take them out of the world, but that Thou shouldest keep them from the evil. They are not of the world, even as I am not of the world. Sanctify them through Thy truth: Thy word is truth.

As Thou hast sent Me into the world, even so have I also sent them into the world. And for their sakes I sanctify Myself, that they also might be sanctified through the truth.

Neither pray I for these alone, but for them also which shall believe on Me through their word; that they all may be one; as Thou, Father, art in Me, and I

in Thee, that they also may be one in Us: that the world may believe that Thou hast sent Me.

And the glory which Thou gavest Me I have given them; that they may be one, even as We are one: I in them, and Thou in Me, that they may be made perfect in one; and that the world may know that Thou hast sent Me, and hast loved them, as Thou hast loved Me. [emphasis added]

Father, I will that they also, whom Thou hast given Me, be with Me where I am; that they may behold My glory, which Thou hast given Me: for Thou lovedst Me before the foundation of the world.

O righteous Father, the world hath not known Thee: but I have known Thee, and these have known that Thou hast sent Me. And I have declared unto them Thy name, and will declare it; that the love wherewith Thou hast loved Me may be in them, and I in them. [emphasis added]



A SPIRITUAL WARFARE PRAYER

Father in Heaven,

I declare that Jesus has rendered the devil powerless (Hebrews 2.14). I have victory in Jesus. Sin has no power over me. Through Christ I have made a radical breach with sin, am delivered from the kingdom of darkness (Colossians 1.13) and enjoy vital spiritual union with Jesus Christ (1 Corinthians 6). Jesus Christ is the center of my life, its foundation and focus. I have surrendered self and sin to Jesus.

I repent of rebellion, idolatry, greed, stubbornness, and selfishness. By faith in the Blood of Jesus I loose myself from _____, and I choose to walk in harmony and union with my Holy Father, Jesus Christ, and the Holy Spirit, the One, true and living Godhead.

I am crucified with Christ: nevertheless I live; yet not I, but Christ lives in me: and the life which I now live in the flesh I live by the faith of the Son of God, who loved me, and gave Himself for me. I do not frustrate the grace of God (Galatians 2.20, 21a). Knowing this, that my "old man" is crucified with Him, that the body of sin might be destroyed, that henceforth I should not serve sin (Romans 6.6). I am Christ's and have crucified the flesh with the affections and lusts. I live in the Spirit and also walk in the Spirit. I am not desirous of vain glory, provoking others or envying others (Galatians 5.24-26). God forbid that I should glory, save in the cross of my Lord Jesus Christ, by whom the world is crucified unto me, and I unto the world (Galatians 6.14).

I renounce satan and all his works. I choose to repent of sin, submit myself to God, resist the devil, and walk by faith in accord with the truth of God's Word, in harmony with the heart, mind, and will of God.

I have judicial acquittal now (Romans 5). I have Jesus exalted as King of kings and Lord of lords now (Revelation 17.14). I have overcome by faith (1 John 2.13, 14; Revelation 12.11; 1 John 5.4). I have the Holy Spirit now (Romans 8). I have resurrection power now (Romans 6-8). I am a citizen of heaven now (Ephesians 1, 2). I am a new creation now (2 Corinthians 5.17). I taste of the powers of the age to come now (Hebrews 6.5). I have eternal life now (John 6.47; 1 John 5.13). I have power to be the child of God now (John 1.12). I am confident of this very thing, that He which hath begun a good work in me will perform it until the day of Jesus Christ (Philippians 1.6).

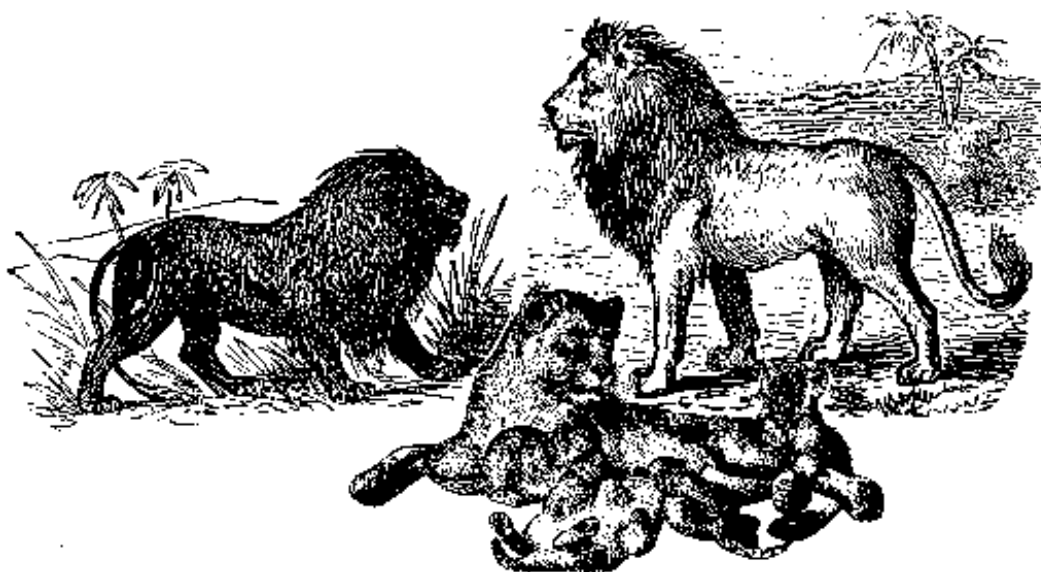

Though I walk in the flesh, I do not war after the flesh: (For the weapons of our warfare are not carnal, but mighty through God to the pulling down of strongholds;) casting down imaginations, and every high thing that exalts itself against the knowledge of God, and bringing into captivity every thought to the obedience of Christ (2 Corinthians 10.3-5).

The battle is the Lord's and the Lamb shall overcome for He is Lord of lords and King of kings (Revelation 17.14). I am of good cheer because Jesus has overcome the world (John 16.33) and came to destroy the works of the devil (1 John 3.8). I overcome because greater is He that is in me, than he that is in the world (1 John 4.4).
